As a matter of fact, I was at work, and I was feeling low and just different pains and stuff. I don't know if I experienced that here or not, but I was just drinking Sprite and stuff like that. Taking Xanax and things. Called my doctor's office. They told me to go up Hopkins. Still worked; I worked a 12-hour shift that day. And went up Hopkins. I was still in the ER, popped a Xanax. They'd taken my EKGs and stuff. Told me not to take no more. That night, transported me upstairs. And the next day they did the stent.

So you literally endured a heart attack while you were on the job here and you finished your shift?

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Kelly (<u>00:43</u>):

Not only that. It would be about a year, a year and a half before that, I had a stroke. I was over there making spaghetti. Had numbness in my arm all the way up to here. They didn't even realize it. And I didn't experience a lot of that. But I'm still here, so. I don't know if it's dedication or just crazy.
