I might take something from somebody. I might rob somebody. You think they're going to just lay down? And this guy just took my money, and I ain't doing nothing to him? I ain't going to do nothing back?

Speaker 2 (<u>00:56</u>): But you feel like it's worth the risk then?

Yusuf Ali (<u>00:59</u>):

If you got a record like mine, the jobs are not hiring. They're looking at your record, "Oh, you did a second, three-time felon. You can't... Nah, we ain't having that." I had just came home at the beginning of the year, and I just got caught up in this drug life again because I couldn't find a job fast enough. And so now, I could be on my way back to jail because of some fines I ain't paid yet. They want me to pay like a thousand dollars as soon as I come home, but how can I do that if I don't have a job? And now you got to go back out here and sell drugs because you can't get a job fast enough.

The drug trade is just not my only hustle. Man, you can tell me cut your grass for \$50, I'm going to cut it. You tell me to dig a hole for a hundred dollars, I'm going to dig that hole. You know what I mean? I don't care what you're using the hole for. I'm going to dig it. You know what I mean? You can be ready to throw a body in there, how big you want it? I'm going to dig it for you. So, it never stops.
