Olivier Gainyo:

If you stick around, you will see how we make pizza. My name is Olivier Gainyo and here I'm making pizza. I'm a pizza guy. I'm originally from Cameroon and a United States citizen today. Since I got here, I start working with Jewish people and I live with them since then.

Speaker 2:

Was that part of your faith community before you came to the US?

Olivier Gainyo:

No, no, no. I'm a Christian Catholic. I'm a Catholic Christian.

Over the years, I think we've had over 1,100 employees go through the store. I've had a lot of relatives work here. I've had a lot of people of different faiths, different color, different languages. And it all works.

Speaker 3:

When I was 20 years old and I approached the landlord of this building to open up a pizza store, a kosher pizza store. And I dropped out of college and opened up the pizza store. We opened the store some day... I don't remember the exact date in March that we opened in 1984.

And I was downtown getting my final license. I didn't even wait to get back here to see the doors open. I called and said, "Open the doors. I got the license." And by the time I got here, the store was full of customers.
