I'm from Yemen. I came to the United States in 2007. I came to study. I finished my college back home. I'm lawyer, and I come here, I say, "I'm going to take the master." But, I stopped study, I have a lot of things to do. So, especially in America, if I don't work, it's hard to do with. I stopped with the business, I

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continue the business, I have a lot of thing. I have family. I have in a big family. I have to take care of them. I have two kids, my mom, my sisters, brothers... big family. This time is hard back home. Almost now, two years wars in Yemen. No electric, no gas, no nothing. Nothing.
